Rules

1. All entry forms must be received on the Friday before the show.
No entry will be accepted on the day of the show.
2. All exhibits to be in the hall between 8.30 and 11.00 on Show Day.
3. Exhibits in classes 1 - 20 and 25 - 51 must be cultivated in the Parish by the Exhibitor.
4. No substitution of class entries may be made (i.e. the exhibit must be the same as the entry form shows).
5. All exhibits in cookery to be made since 1. 9. 2010.
- 5a. All exhibits in craft to be new entries only. Previous exhibits not accepted.
6. Cookery to be exhibited on the white card plates provided.
7. No person admitted during the judging except the Judges, Secretary and others appointed by the Committee.
8. The Committee will entertain any objections to the character of the articles shown only when the objector has paid £1 to the Secretary on the Show Day. This amount will be forfeited if on investigation the objection proves to be of a frivolous nature. Articles objected to will be retained by the Committee until a settlement is arrived at.
9. The Judges and the Committee have the power to reduce the number of prizes if, in the opinion of the Judges, the entries are not up to the required standard. A third may be given if there are four or more entries. The Judges decision is final.
10. Exhibitors may show more than one entry in a class.
11. No entries may be removed until after the presentation of prizes. Any perishable item not removed by 5.30pm shall be sold.
12. Any exhibitor attempting to gain a prize dishonestly shall forfeit all claims to prizes won.
13. All prize money shall be paid on the afternoon of the Show on production of prize cards after 4.30pm.
14. In the event of the Judges being unable to decide the merit of an exhibit they shall have the power to call in an umpire to decide.
15. Any exhibit an exhibitor wishes to give to the Society will be sold after the presentation of prizes.
16. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any item for exhibition.
17. All exhibits to be made or grown in Scawby except classes 95 to 98.
18. Entry Fee: All classes 10p, Children's entries free.

NB Scawby Parish shall be held to include all Scawby Brook, all Greetwell and Twigmoor and Holme Lane as far as the Golf Links.

Members are reminded that subscriptions are due on January 1st Discounts may be refused if a current membership card is not produced.
